National Breast Cancer Awareness Month



California State Parks (CSP) has announced that for October 2019, CSP will again be participating in a project for National Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

The **Pink Patch** Project (#PinkPatchProject) was started by the Los Angeles County Police Chiefs Association several years ago as a public awareness campaign designed to bring attention to the fight against breast cancer and to support breast cancer research and treatment organizations in combating this devastating disease.

The program centers on a pink version of an agency's uniform patch. These patches have been specially designed by each participating agency specifically for the Pink Patch Project campaign. Employees at each of the participating agencies may wear these pink patches on their regular uniforms for the entire month of October during "Breast Cancer Awareness Month."

The pink patches and other related items are intended to stimulate conversation with the community and to encourage public awareness about the importance of early detection and the on-going fight against this disease.

Individuals can support awareness by purchasing and wearing the CSP **Pink Bear** items from the Ranger Foundation (a California public benefit non-profit 501(c)(3) organization). Other partners directly supporting this effort are the California State Park Rangers Association, the Resource Protection Peace Officers Association and the California State Parks Anniversary Committee. The CSP logo, dubbed the **Pink Bear**, are available as a patch and as a lapel pin. A SPPO badge, featuring the design as a center seal, is also authorized. The patch, pin and badge are authorized by CSP to be worn by uniformed staff during the month of October and the lapel pin at any time by non-uniformed staff. New this year is a limited supply of pink bear patches for volunteers and lifeguards.

It is California State Parks intention to have this program recur in future years.
