OF

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Wesley E. Cater and Doug Bryce certify:

1. That they are the president and secretary, respectively, of the California State Park Rangers Association, a California corporation.

2. That at a meeting of the board of said corporation, duly held at Sacramento, California, on June 16, 1970, the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved: That Article II of the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation be amended by adding the following:

'However, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activity or exercise any powers that a re not in furtherance of the primary puroses of this corporation'." 3. That the members of said corporation have unequal voting power.
