### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Recently I was in a California State Parks District all hands meeting where the District Superintendent asked the large crowd of State Park staff, volunteers, and partners, "Who's heard of *Parks Forward*?" Surprisingly and unfortunately, few hands went up. The *Parks Forward* Initiative is an independent commission assessing the financial, operational, and cultural challenges facing California State Parks, with the hope of ensuring long term viability.

The Parks Forward Initiative is charged with a very important mission that obviously affects California State Parks, park professionals, and the resources and the public that we serve. I recommend all CSPRA members take the time to check out the *Parks Forward* Website, http:// www.parksforward.com. You can even watch past Parks Forward public meetings and commission meetings online. I also encourage you to visit the comment section of the website and provide written comments on this important initiative.

A current focal point of *Parks Forward* is using partnerships to create efficiencies and make the California State Park System more sustainable. I encourage park professionals who have valuable experience working with many different valued partners to provide comments and feedback to *Parks Forward* regarding partnerships.

CSPRA Board Members and I recently met with the staff from the Parks Forward Initiative. The main points that CSPRA emphasized are:

The Mission: CSPRA supports the current Department mission. Recent reports like the California Research Bureau Report, California State Parks: A Budget Overview, have mentioned that if State Parks is truly to become an enterprise agency and generate more revenue that it should consider including revenue generation in its mission While CSPRA supports statement. the Department's efforts to increase revenue and improve efficiencies where appropriate, CSPRA ardently supports the current mission of California State Parks

**Budget**: State Parks needs stable and consistent funding. California State Parks generate billions of dollars for the California economy and hundreds of millions of dollars of tax revenue annually. Yet, State Parks General Fund support is \$116 Million and accounts for approximately 0.1% of all General Fund spending for California.

The Generalist Ranger: CSPRA supports the generalist ranger concept currently utilized by California State Parks. The Generalist Ranger provides quality services at an economical price to our visitors and the citizens of California.

**Park Management**: CSPRA supports improving leadership development training, experience, and promotional opportunities for qualified park professionals in all classifications.

Training: CSPRA supports investing in State Park employees. State Parks needs to continue to provide initial and ongoing training for park professionals in core program areas; maintenance, resource protection, interpretation and education, public safety, and recreation. If State Parks needs to improve other functions such as marketing, revenue generation, or partnerships, than professional training to state park professionals should increase on these functions.

Exams: CSPRA supports improving the system of exams used in State Parks. Exams should be timely and should increase the Department,s efforts to recruit, retain, and promote valuable employees.

One of the things that the *Parks* 

Forward staff mentioned is that several entities have recommended changes for California State Parks, including the Legislative Analyst's Office and the Little Hoover Commission, and those recommendations have never been enacted. One way to ensure that Parks Forward recommendations will be successfully enacted is receiving input from State Park professionals in all parts of the process. I encourage all CSPRA members to provide input in all phases of the Parks Forward Initiative Process.

In many cases, the acorn doesn't fall far from the tree. 

#### LORIN FORSYTH

Lorin, age 92, passed away in November from a stroke. After growing up in Southern California, Lorin joined the Navy in 1942, serving in the Philipines during WWII. He began his State Park career in San Clemente and worked as a Ranger at Palomar, Anza-Borrego Desert, Mt. San Jacinto, Stinson Beach, Colusa and Chico. He was supervisor of the Sonoma Area State Parks in the 1980s. He retired after 30 years as Area Manager of Lake Perris State Recreation Area. In his



later years, Lorin enjoyed traveling in his RV and managing campgrounds in northern parks. He is survived by his sons Don and James and many grandchilddren, great-grandchildren, and even one great-great grandchild.
